A Call to Reverence

From the earliest days, the Church has veiled what is sacred — the tabernacle, the chalice, and the altar — not to hide them, but to honor the holy presence they hold.

In the same spirit, when a woman veils before the Lord, she acknowledges that she too is sacred, a living temple of His presence.



Veiling is not an obligation but a response of love — an outward sign of an inward devotion.

When a woman veils, she mirrors Mary's humility and reveals her dignity as a daughter of God.

The Heart of Mary

From My Heart

My first veil was a gift — a simple piece of lace, but it carried something sacred.

When I placed it over my head for the first time, it felt like a holy mantle resting on me, as if the Blessed Mother herself was drawing me closer to her Son.

In that stillness, the noise of the world faded. It was just me and Jesus — my heart veiled in His presence.

Now the Lord is asking me to share that same gift with others, so that every woman who feels the gentle tug of His love may know the peace found beneath His Mother's mantle.

She is my role model, and ours — the one who teaches us how to say “yes,” how to be hidden in love, and how to let our souls magnify the Lord.
